Is the Rep a school Alum? Yes Is the Rep involved in the admissions process? Yes

Last year's Freshman Profile: GPA - 3.6-3.8 average SAT - 1240-1420 average (1600 scale) ACT - 27-32 average

GPA -How is it calculated? Core vs Cumulative? CORE Weighted vs. Unweighted? UNWEIGHTED

ACT/SAT – Written Portion? Super Score? Furman is a 'test optional' school, placing greater emphasis on the GPA. They do superscore. They have no preference between SAT or ACT.

Rigor - What are the average AP requirements? Varies---they are looking for rigor---they take into account how many AP classes your school offers and the percentage that a student chooses to take.

Extra-Curricular Activities – What does the school look for? Where a student's passions lie and how he or she made a difference in whatever the activity was----leadership, dedication. Was the student involved in his or her community in a way that left an impact?

Most popular majors at this school: Pre-med, pre-law, health science, biology, chemistry, business, political science, communication studies. ¼ of the students choose a double major. You have until the end of your Sophomore year to declare a major. 84% of students graduate in four years.

For out-of-state schools, are there any majors that would qualify for the Academic Common Market? no Does chosen major affect decision process? no

Study Abroad Programs? Summer Programs, Semester-Long Programs, Foreign Language Programs? 45% of Furman students participate in a study abroad program. 85% of the programs (25 total) are led by Furman professors and attended only by Furman students. There are also "study away" programs within the U.S. Furman also offers a "May-mester" 3-week term in May.

Internships / Co-Op Opportunities? No co-ops. 75% of students participate in internships or research. 200 part-time internships with businesses.

Research Opportunities?

Ranked 4th in the nation for undergrad research. 75% of students participate in internships or research. About 50% of students doing research are published by the time they graduate.

Special successes the school is known for: Furman is listed as one of the top 10 most beautiful campuses in the nation

Scholarships: Are there any specific to our area or for Georgia students? No

When are scholarship deadlines? Special scholarship applications due Dec 15. The majority of Early Action students are automatically entered upon admission for merit-based scholarships.

86% of Furman students receive scholarships or financial aid. The average financial aid package is \$30-35K.

Upcoming On-Campus visit dates not to be missed? Nov. 14, 2015 is "Fall for Furman" which includes tickets to a Furman Palladins football game, tailgating, an academic fair where you'll meet professors, and a campus tour. The spring 2016 Open House dates have not yet been announced.

When are application deadlines? Different decisions: Early Action, Binding, Early Decision, Regular Decision, Rolling?

Early Decision (binding): apply by Nov. 1, you will hear by Nov. 15
Early Action (non-binding): apply by Nov. 1, you will hear by Dec, 20
Regular Decision: apply by Jan. 15, you will hear by March 1

Is an essay required for all decision options? The essay portion of the Common App

Are letters of Recommendation required or suggested? Not required. 2-3 is a "healthy" number to submit.

Is an in-person interview required or suggested? No

Does the school use the Common App? Yes, they are Common App exclusive

How many applicants are received per year? 5100 total with 710 in current freshman class 64-67% acceptance rate

Campus Life

NCAA Criteria (Division I, II, etc)?

20 Division 1 athletic teams which play in the Southern Conference.

Are sporting events free? Is there a ticket lottery? All sporting events are free to students----no ticket lottery needed.

Do freshmen live on campus? Are cars allowed? Furman is 100% residential with all students living on-campus all four years. Cars are allowed all four years. A shuttle takes students back and forth to downtown Greenville.

What are the dorms like: hall-style, suite-style, apartment-style? Living & Learning Dorms? Freshmen and Sophomores live in hall-style dorms, some with sinks in room, co-ed by floor. Laundry service is included. There are apartments for Juniors and Seniors a bit further away from campus to give them a different on-campus living experience. Furman has a housing website which shows details and floor plans.

Campus Life (requirements, restaurants/cafeterias, clubs/activities, etc)

- -- 100+ student organizations
- --Club and intermural sports
- --Strong music, theater and visual arts programs open to all students.
- --200+ Cultural Life Programs for which students receive a point if they attend. 32 CLP points are required for -- graduation (encourages students to learn/grow, experience a variety of things which in college).
- -- Lots of activities planned for students as all live on campus.
- --One dining hall for all students with a variety of offerings. Also a food court with Moe's, Chick Fil-A, etc.

What is the undergraduate enrollment? Furman is primarily an undergraduate school. There are no graduate-level Teaching Assistants.
