NCAA Criteria (Division I, II, etc.)? Division II, in the Peach Belt Conference. Men's ~Basketball, Baseball, Golf, Tennis, and Soccer. Men's Baseball, and Golf. Women's ~ Basketball, Tennis, and Soccer. Softball and Cross Country

Are sporting events free? Is there a ticket lottery?

Do freshmen live on campus? Are cars allowed? Freshmen live on campus. FYE (first year experience) residential program geared to help freshmen acclimate to college life. Cars allowed, parking is \$18/year.

What are the dorms like: hall-style, suite-style, apartment-style? Living & Learning Dorms? Private or semi-private rooms, 2 people share bathrooms. Computer labs with study lounges and planned activities. 500 freshmen are housed together. All dorms were remodeled after 2006 Campus Life (requirements, restaurants/cafeterias, clubs/activities, etc.)

Unlimited meal plans, 60 clubs and organizations, Rock climbing wall, golf course, indoor/outdoor pools Club and intramural sports, student Gov., religious organizations, Honor society.

What is the undergraduate enrollment? 3049 freshmen class increased 25% in fall 2016 Total enrollment? 4000

Percentage of male: female -65% female, 35% male

Percentage of in-state: out-of-state students – 92.7% GA Students 3.5% from other states 3.8% from foreign countries 37 countries represented

Percentage of students participating in Greek Life – 14 different houses. Sororities do not have houses, only fraternities.

Where is the school located? 135 miles south of Atlanta in Americus, GA. Other: 17:1 student/teacher ratio
