- Satisfy the National Collegiate Athletic Association standards for student-athletes who are full or partial qualifiers under Division I guidelines.
- The typical Honors College freshman achieved approximately a 30 ACT composite score and a 3.8 GPA

GPA - How is it calculated? For admissions, it's weighted core. For scholarships, its weighted cumulative. Grades 9-11
