**Is the Rep a school Alum?** No      **Is the Rep involved in the admissions process?** Yes

**Last year's Freshman Profile:** GPA - 3.41-3.91 mid 50%    SAT - 1280-1410 verbal & math    New SAT- 1340-1460  
ACT - 29-32

**GPA -How is it calculated?** Core vs. Cumulative? Weighted vs. unweighted? All weights are taken off for Honors AP courses. They use a 4.0 scale

**ACT/SAT – Written Portion? Super score?** Do not require writing. Only super score the SAT. Take highest composite score for the ACT

**Rigor - What are the average AP requirements?** Rigor of high school curriculum is considered for both admission and scholarships. SMU grants credit and placement for scores of 4 or 5 on most AP exams.

**Extra-Curricular Activities –What does the school look for?** SMU looks holistically at the applicants. Demonstrated interest is a benefit for applicants

**Most popular majors at this school:** More than 100 Majors & 85 Minors. They are highly ranked across the board for many majors.

**For out-of-state schools, are there any majors that would qualify for the Academic Common Market?** N/A- Private

**Does chosen major affect decision process?** Only for Performing Arts majors in which an audition is required. All other incoming 1st year students are accepted as pre-majors in the Dedman College of Humanities and Sciences, regardless of their intended major.

**Study Abroad Programs? Summer Programs, Semester-Long Programs, Foreign Language Programs?** Yes. 1/3 of all students participate in a study abroad program. 3<sup>rd</sup> oldest study abroad program in the US. 9<sup>th</sup> largest with 150 programs, something for every major.

**Internships / Co-Op Opportunities?** The average student will have 3 internships before graduation; Voted #6 in US for internship Opportunities by Princeton Review in 2015

**Research Opportunities?** The Honors College offers funding for undergraduate research

**Scholarships: Are there any specific to our area or for Georgia students?** The Hunt Scholarship requires a separate essay, you tube video and teacher recommendations. This scholarship provides almost full tuition and a junior year study abroad. The Presidential scholarship provides full tuition and the junior year study abroad. There are several other scholarships as well. In order to be considered, applications must be submitted by January 15.

When are application deadlines? Different decisions: Early Action, Binding, Early Decision, Regular Decision, Rolling?

**Nov 1- Early Action & Early Decision I                      January 15 -Regular Decision & Early Decision II**

**Deadlines are important because of the amount of spaces for incoming freshmen**

Is an essay required for all decision options? **No- but the Honors College requires 2 essays and 2 letters of rec.**

Are letters of recommendation required or suggested? **Yes-for the Honors College**

Is an in-person interview required or suggested? **Only for the McNair Scholarship should student be selected as a candidate (This is the top scholarship with 100% tuition paid; they offer 20 per year)**

What does the school look for in each "round" of decisions?

Does the school use the Common App? **Yes. The school has its own as an option but the admissions rep highly recommends using the common application because most students look better from it. For scholarship applications, using the Common App is important because the common app is more organized.**
